
Presidents Report for 1 February 2017

CLUB MEETINGS (PLEASE READ)

The Board has decided to reinstate the role of Meeting Greeter to improve the social environment at meetings.

Whilst the Club Greeter role can vary across clubs the main role is to ensure that Club Members, Guests (including Speakers), and Visitors are given the opportunity to enjoy their Rotary experience. The Greeter should be active in welcoming **ALL** attendees at our meetings as they walk through the entrance to the meeting. In particular they should **introduce** themselves to all Guests, Potential Members and Speakers at each meeting. If Guest Speakers do not have a "host" member who can look after them the Greeter should introduce them to the Chairperson for the night. The Chairperson can then assume responsibility of looking after the Guest Speaker. The Guest Speaker should sit with the Chairperson so they can be familiar with meeting protocols and also so that introductory information can be obtained from them if not already to hand.

The Greeter should introduce Guests and Guest Speakers to the Club President at the earliest opportunity before the meeting. Greeters should also **ensure** that Visitors, Guest Speakers and Potential Members are not left alone before, during or prior to departing the meeting. In order to do the Greeter role properly it is suggested the nominated greeter should arrive at meetings 15 minutes prior to the usual start time (ie before 6pm).

Whilst some members will not feel comfortable in this role, it is expected that **all members** will participate over the Rotary year at some point, as it is not fair on all, to allocate this role to just a few of the more outgoing members in the club.

Happy new year 2017! We hope that you had a peaceful and enjoyable holiday period, and that you've been able to start the new year positively.

We are just past the half-way mark of Mongolia's notoriously long winter season. Unfortunately this year has brought another 'dzud' to the country; a natural phenomenon unique to Mongolia whereby a dry summer precedes a very cold winter causing a disaster for herders in the countryside. At our home in Gachuurt we've seen temperatures below -40°C (-40°F) compounded by strong winds and snow. But thanks to your support we at Lotus can keep warm, happy and healthy.
