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Presidents Report for 1 March 2017 (provided by Terry this week as Pres has gone awol) It is some time since we have scheduled a club information night, and judging by the excellent attendance, asking The Three Amigos to conduct this session proved to be a pretty good drawcard.

Geoff Logie Smith chaired the meeting, but set the scene with a few comments on how the external environment for clubs like ours has changed, but we have more than met the challenges. Our fundraising efforts this year have been absolutely superb, and this has once again allowed us to "punch above our weight" with our Rotary projects. Positive comments to this effect from Rotarians from other Clubs confirm this.

We should never rest on our laurels. Terry made some constructive observations on how we can improve the management and communication in the club. Most of us are time poor, and the more we can streamline internal communications and processes, the more we can achieve for Rotary projects with the same effort. Terry discussed the role of the Board, and how it should focus more on medium term planning. A better understanding of our organisational structure and our committee system in particular, will show members how everybody can better understand how they contribute. Committees can effectively run projects without the time consuming process of Board involvement. Terry is also particularly keen to improve the way we help new members understand Rotary, and how the club works.

Sean spoke on how a structured information package for members, to address these and other issues is overdue. Sean is working on a programme of training modules and information sessions, which we hope to introduce to members over the next three months. Longer serving members will appreciate the re-enforcing of the core values of Rotary, including the Four Way Test. Newer members will appreciate the more comprehensive introduction to Rotary, the club structure and the projects.

For the information of members, this week we made payments to Australian Rotary Health (\$1200), ROMAC (\$1000) and Rotary Foundation (\$1500) in accordance with our budget.

A bit has happened since my last email on Fri 17 Feb. You will recall that Fidelcia was moved to ICU early on that day due to some breathing difficulties. Glad to say that by later that afternoon all was back to 'normal' and Fidelcia was returned to her Ward - Koala, Room 324.

Just as things settled down for Fidelcia, her mum, Hernania, became ill with a sore throat on the Fri evening. Between the efforts of home host Liz Olie, Yulitta Owen (Timorese volunteer/interpreter) and some of Hernanias's friends who happened to be visiting her, the situation was controlled with Panadol overnight. The next morning Liz took Hernania to her GP where she was examined and prescribed antibiotics. Thankfully, Hernania's condition has settled down and today she is back to normal.

Whilst our ROMAC children are patients of the hospital, the parents are not and their medical needs, and even provision of food, need to be arranged separately. In regard to food for Hernania, members of the local Australian Timorese Community, coordinated by Katrina Langford, one of our volunteer Tetun interpreters, have swung into action arranging a roster of people to bring food into the hospital. As it turns out, food is also being prepared for Fidelcia as she is not too keen on the hospital fare. My thanks to the members of the Timorese Community for helping out in this way.

As I go to print, things are progressing as expected in stabilising Fidelcia's condition. Nevertheless, her surgeons advised today that Fidelcia must be totally clear of her chest infection before they can contemplate surgery. Consequently, at his stage, her surgery will not occur 'before next week'.

This means she will have at least a week in Koala ward before her surgery; giving us plenty of time to drop in and say hello. Please could you make some time to do so.

Update:

R-1081 Fidelcia - Update

Since the last update on Mon 20 Feb little Fidelcia has been on somewhat of a roller coaster ride. After returning to her Koala Ward room she had a relapse early Tues morning, experiencing breathing difficulties again, and she was returned to ICU around 6am. She has been there ever since on a ventilator and being fed by tube.

She gradually improved during the week and today the ventilator was removed and she started to be fed normally, starting with white bread, her favourite food back home. Katrina Langford, one of our volunteer Tetun interpreters, then swung into action and organised that this afternoon some rice porridge was going to be delivered to the hospital for Fidelcia.

As her condition is starting to improve, the indications from the Cardiac Team are that Fidelcia's heart operation might now be possible next Mon or Tues.

Mum, Hernania, whilst still taking medication, is getting over her cold and has established regular contact with her family back home keeping them up to date on progress. She is also receiving regular visits from members of the Timorese community to bring in food or to just have a chat. Whilst in the ICU, when Fidelcia is under the constant care of her nurse, Hernania has been able to get some good sleep so she is much better within herself. She is comfortable with what is happening around her and with what is being done for Fidelcia.

The way things are now moving, the next update, in a day or two, will hopefully be after Fidelcia's operation. Regards
