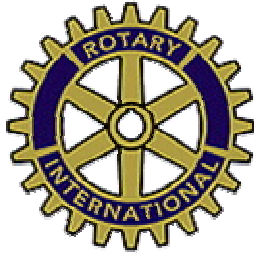

ROMAC - Patricio and the week's news

Dear D9810 ROMAC Team,

Over the last week Patricio has continued his good progress at home with the Lecks, eating and sleeping well and getting plenty of exercise exploring the neighbourhood and kicking the Aussie Rules football. After a visit to the Hawks Nest at Waverley park with Phil he is now a died in the wool Hawks supporter. On Sunday night, the side effects of the chemotherapy were evident as he started to lose some of his hair – he understands that this would occur and has taken it in his stride.

On Sunday he visited the Healesville Sanctuary and had a close encounter with Gem the 9 yo wombat and on Tue evening he attended a RC of Lilydale meeting about the Timor Roofing Project and had the opportunity to meet volunteers from Timor Leste. He was presented with a Rotary 17/18 theme badge, of which he is very proud. Many thanks to Kay and Phil Leck who have looked after Patricio and Norberto so wonderfully well over the last few weeks.

Today Patricio changed host families and Dianne and Gavan McIntyre (RC of Wandin) took him into the RCH for a blood test and a meeting with his Oncologist, Dr Michael Sullivan. In general, Dr Sullivan is pleased with his recovery from the surgery, how he is coping with the chemotherapy and that he has gained weight (5kg). Dr Sullivan did note, however, that following today's blood test, Patricio's platelets and a particular tumour marker would need to improve if his next chemotherapy session was to commence as scheduled on Mon 30 Oct. A further blood test will be done early on that Mon and if the results are ok the chemotherapy will proceed afterwards. If not, the chemotherapy will be delayed until the results reach the desired levels.

Tomorrow afternoon Patricio will have his dental work done under general anaesthetic and some abdominal sutures will be removed at the same time.

From tomorrow Norm Casey will fill my role as Chair D9810 ROMAC Committee as I will be out of town until mid Nov.
