President's Report for 10 February 2016

The meeting just passed was a real winner. We had an excellent turn out to listen to two outstanding speakers from the Monash Mens Shed Incorporated. Both Greg Male and John Gillies (former Mayor of Monash 2008) delivered a succinct and interesting account on the purpose and programs undertaken at the Mens Shed in their Bogong Avenue location in Glen Waverley. With over 160 members at this particular shed, and over 1000 mens sheds across Australia (more Sheds than McDonald's outlets!), this is a massive initiative. The importance of 'belonging to community' and having 'a place to go', is something that can not be understated.

The potential, as described by Greg and John, for a youth chapter of the Monash Mens Shed is something that might be of interest to the RCMW in terms of supporting. Let's see. The second half of the Rotary year is ramping up very quickly.

- There is much happening in the Youth portfolio with **MUNA 2016** almost on our doorstep over Sat 30 Apr and Sun 01 May 16 (Geoff Logie-Smith leading);
- The **Good Friday Golf Day** planning for 25 March is also well underway (Ron Thorpe and Don Guest leading);
- The first of the **Mount Waverley Rotary Market** days is going ahead next Sunday 14 February (Beth Merkus leading);
- The **2016 Conference Rotary District 9810** at Shepparton over 18-20 March (Rhonda McKenzie leading); and
- The **RCMW Garage Sale** scheduled for Sun 21 Feb 16 being held at the Oakleigh Market (Adrian Clifford and Terry Roche leading).

- The **RCMW Board Meeting** (take 2!) was conducted last Wednesday. Secretary Paul Power will be posting the Minutes on the RCMW Intranet Site shortly. I urge all to read as there is a diverse range of actions items on various members.
- Finally, and as a heads up to the Chairs (Community, International, Foundation and Youth), mid-year budget to expenditure updates are required within the next two to three weeks. Aside from assurance that we remain on track for what is scheduled, this is additionally an opportunity to cross level funds amongst Chairs if required and appropriate. Dear D9810 ROMAC Volunteers,

Anton has had a good week at home with Dianne and Bill. He has had visits from DG David and Alison, Gaynor Schols (ROMAC Southern Region Manager), Liz Olie who took him to Chesterfield Farm, and we went to Jells Park to play on the Playgrounds and chase ducks on Fri. He is walking everywhere and likes pushing his pusher. He continues to eat everything, is getting into a better sleeping routine and outwardly is quite robust.

He has been having a daily visit from a nurse who takes blood and gives him medication to improve his blood. Anton's haemoglobin has been going down as a result of the chemotherapy and he was admitted to hospital on Saturday to have a blood transfusion, which was always part of the medical plan. He returned home to Dianne and Bill today. Joy Lane and Norm Casey will visit him this week but more visits are welcome as it gives Dianne some time out to catch up with other things.

Along those lines, I am very grateful that Norm and Denise Casey and Joy lane have put up their hands to look after Anton and Claudina over some upcoming weekends that Dianne and Bill have previously committed too. Their quick response to help was very much appreciated and in true Rotary/ROMAC spirit.

Tomorrow Anton will have a echocardiogram, after which his oncologist will make decisions regarding his chemotherapy regime and when he will likely commence the second round of treatment.
