ADDENDUM : Immediate Past President Terry (Deputising for President Rhonda at the meeting) Chairman Pete Rees introduced Huntingtower Student Daniel Gates, to speak to us on the Simunye Project in South Africa. The Simunye Project is a Huntingtower community service project with a focus on improving and expanding educational and care facilities in South African schools and communities. Daniel's excellent presentation highlighted the plight of children in remote villages and outlined a project he has been involved in to make a difference. Daniel, with others, has been volunteering his time to teach basic literacy skills to young children, who have none of the basic reading intuitions we take for granted with pre school children. This lack of skills means that early teaching of basic skills is made that much more difficult.

Your Board agreed to donate \$250 toward the project. Books and clothing are relatively cheap in these South African Villages, so our donation will help make a big difference.

Numbers were down this week – well down on previous weeks. Next week's speaker, Catherine Smith, will be speaking to us on Road Safety Education, so can we have a very good turnout by members. Remember – good attendances assist in attracting good quality speakers. Terry Roche

# Girl's life-saving visit

HEALESVILLE Sanctuary hosts many international visitors each year, but tourism wasn't Celastina Diaz's first reason for her visit to Australia.

The 11-year old came from Timor Leste to Melbourne to undergo major surgery two weeks ago.

Repairing a hole in her heart and a faulty mitral valve, the surgery was performed at the Royal Children's Hospital.

The trip was sponsored and organised by the Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children, or ROMAC, who brought 45 children to Australia for surgery during 2013-'14.

On her discharge from hospital, Celastina and her mother Natalia have been housed by Liz Olie, a member of the Rotary Club of Doncaster.

Celastina's time in Australia was made especially memorable by her visit to the sanctuary, where she got to see many animals including kangaroos.

Her 'magic moment', an opportunity to get up close

with the kangaroos and meet their keepers, was donated by Healesville Sanctuary along with free admission to the sanctuary.

The Rotary Club of Healesville's Graeme Chester said the club felt it was extremely important to support the ROMAC program.

"The aim of ROMAC is to provide medical treatment for children from developing countries in the form of life-saving or dignity restoring surgery, not accessible to them in their home country," he said.

"We try to give everyone we bring to Australia the chance to experience something more than just the hospital, and the kids get really excited about seeing our native animals."

Celastina will return to Timor Leste when doctors believe she is healthy enough.

### **CLARIFICATION OF DANIEL GATES PRESENTATION**

Ros Clowes was concerned about the quote from our speaker last week that 60% of funds raised by World Vision Australia is spent on Administration costs. She consequently sought clarification of this % from World Vision Australia. This figure is incorrect. World Vision Australia has confirmed that the % spent on Administration, Fundraising and Accountability is in fact 23% of total funds raised for the FY 2014. This figure is disclosed in their published annual report for FY2014.
