Each year for a decade or so, Dame Elisabeth Murdoch has opened her beautiful property 'Cruden Farm" for Baker IDI as a fund-raising and community awareness opportunity. Since her death, this wonderful gesture has continued. I don't know whether the Rotary Club of Mount Waverley may be able to help us out, but as of yesterday (5/4) morning, we now do not have a small group of volunteers to run our BBQ stall; normally one family has done so on our behalf, but an unexpected situation has developed and we are really out on the proverbial limb. The spectacular gardens of the late Dame Elisabeth Murdoch's Cruden Farm will open to the public to support the work of Baker IDI. We are seeking volunteers to help out on the day and would be most grateful for any number of enthusiastic volunteers that you may be able to rally. All volunteers will be provided with free lunch (BBQ/sandwich & bottled water). Entry is free for volunteer staff, plus they receive a free double pass valued at \$50 for friends or family to attend. Volunteers will be assisting with the food and drink stall, and BBQ stall. We are in need of people to cover two different shift times:

9:30am - 12:00pm

12:00pm - 3:00pm

MOUNT WAVERLEY MARKET SAUSAGE SIZZLE IN FLAMES QUICK THINKING SAVES THE DAY, AND THE SAUSAGES.

There were extraordinary scenes today in Hamilton Place, as the market barbeque, manned by stand in cook Charlie Keidge, erupted in flames while being cleaned during preparation for the sausage sizzle. While the top of the barbeque was being heated for cleaning, deposits of fat underneath the unit caught fire, with flames licking the sides of the Rotary trailer, threatening to engulf the cooking area and destroy the trailer signage. Smoke billowed into the air above the roof of adjacent shops, much to the suspected bemusement of the City of Monash staff manning their information booth opposite. Quick thinking by Geoff Logie-Smith, who recognised the danger of billowing white smoke from his experience with classic English cars, saved the situation, as he immediately attacked the seat of the flames with the fire extinguisher. Charlie was then able to get at the barbeque and move it away from the trailer so that the fire could be put out.

Fortunately, the fire removed most of the accumulated fat, and the fire extinguisher powder, which covered everything in site, was quickly wiped away. It was quite an experience for Charlie, who stood in at short notice for regular cook Adrian Clifford. He was too shocked to be interviewed for some time.

Overall the market day was very successful, with takings of \$1050, up on previous months, thanks of course to the planning and works on the day of seemingly tireless Beth and Charlie. Sausage Sizzle - \$372.85 (after expenses). A total of 178 sausages were sold.
