Anton Da Silva - Update 7 Jun 16

Dear D9810 Team and Supporters,

Much better news this update than the last. Anton was released from hospital the day after my last update and since then has been enjoying the life of Riley with Dianne and Bill. He has been tucking into his food, having many outings and generally getting into winter mode with some new warmer clothing. With central line removed, he had his first bath whilst he has been here and thoroughly enjoyed it.

Today, the family met with Dr Downie to ascertain the way ahead. The good news was that his heart was not affected by the stronger drug administered during the last chemo session, thus he has been scheduled to have his 7th chemo cycle starting tomorrow. This will start with surgery to insert a temporary line into his arm. After this 20 day cycle is completed and, allowing time for hospitalisation due to possible infections and final echo/MRI, Anton and Claudina will 'probably' be able to return home by mid July.

I visited Bradley today after his operation on his nose yesterday. Prof. Andrew Heggie visited him this morning and has given the all clear for his discharge tomorrow 6th June home to the Cox Family. I will take him to have the stitches removed on Wednesday morning and will check on his suitability for travel later in June.

Bradley has been in contact with his family in Port Moresby and photos have been exchanged keeping everyone in the loop. Thanks to Dianne & Gavin McIntyre for their support of Bradley and the Cox Family.
