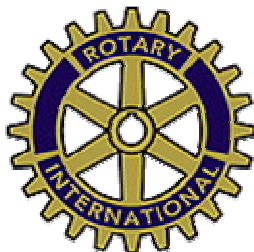

Members will be well aware of the amount of community work that Geoff and Margaret are involved in. However, members know little of the work that Geoff has been undertaking with the voluntary organisation BlazeAid. Geoff spoke of how BlazeAid was formed following the devastating bush fires in 2009, particularly on Black Saturday in Victoria. He described the work that BlazeAid volunteers have been doing in recent years, not only in Victoria, mainly cleanup and repair of farm fencing and a little of the logistics involved. He spoke and a little of the logistics involved. He spoke particularly of his experience recently helping with farm fencing, with others, in Garibaldi, south of Ballarat. Bill Klucso has also been involved with BlazeAid.

ROMAC Teretoriano Da Silva - Update 12 Mar 16

Dear D9810 ROMAC Supporters,

Anton has had some milestones since my last update on 1 Mar. He has graduated to sleeping by himself in his cot, which gives Claudina a more restful night, and he, and Claudina, had their first visit to a hairdresser. Anton is happy with his new bald style and can't stop rubbing his hands over his head.

On last Tue he had a series of scans and on Wed we learned that his abdominal and chest scans were clear of any cancer and his blood test was perfect. Consequently, his doctors authorised another two chemotherapy cycles after which further scans will be taken. He commenced his 3rd chemotherapy cycle on Thu and he will be in MMC, 41 North, for 5 days whilst the drugs are administered. After that he will return to Dianne and Bill's home for a couple of weeks before the next cycle commences. The scans/tests also revealed that there are no signs of TB but he will continue on his TB medication for a further 6 months. His heart is still enlarged and working at around 2/3 efficiency but it has not been adversely affected by the chemo to date.

I saw him yesterday and he is a bundle of energy and 'firing on all 8 cylinders'. He looks to have grown a couple of inches and was a laugh a minute having a great time playing, bouncing on his bed and chuckling with his grandmother and yours truly.

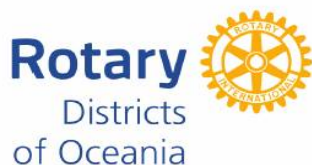
