#### Rhonda's Report (for 18 February)

Gloria Hargreaves from RAM shared some information about Malaria with us. Malaria is spread far and wide and kills more people than we could ever imagine. It is always good to hear of some of the Rotary projects and RAM was no exception. It makes us realise how far the arms of Rotary reach when it comes to doing good in the world. Once again it is great to see so many members at the meetings. The atmosphere is so friendly and welcoming. Leonie Dillon and David Bloom, it was a pleasure to welcome you to another club meeting. We all look forward to getting to know you better. We hope to see you at our social evening this coming Wednesday. I would just gently like to remind members to

please let Keith know if you will or will not be attending the meetings so that he can arrange the catering for the right numbers.

During the month of March we are going to collect pre school books for Indigenous Australian children. Would you please get in touch with your children, grandchildren and any friends or family who may have some books in this category that we can collect and send to the Northern Territory. Terry will be arranging for a collection tub to be at the Rotary meeting following the social night. Once again keep in mind that they are for Pre school age children to encourage them to want to love books and reading. We will also be sending out letters to Book publishers to see whether they can assist.

Terry continues to bring the bin for donations of food that go to the MWCIS. If you are like me, you would like to contribute but at the time you forget to bring something along in spite of your best intentions. We are going to trial a SMS reminder, prior to the meeting, for a little while to see how it works. I think there is no doubting the good work that is done by this volunteer organisation so all assistance would be appreciated.

The club's board meeting was also held last week. Following are some of the decisions and outcomes from the meeting:

- \$1,000 will be donated to Donations in Kind to assist with the transport of all the equipment that has been accumulated to enable it to get to those in need.

- \$500 is also being donated to Safe Water Save Lives. This decision was made in light of the multiplying factor that comes with the donation. We will identify the project and apply the donation to that specific one.

- \$500 is being donated to Downs Syndrome Victoria in lieu of assistance that is normally given to their BBQ on 21st March. Unfortunately with this one, we seem to be low on members assisting so a cash donation is being made instead for this year only.

- This will be the last year that we will be sponsoring the Holmsglen Apprentice of the Year. We will be honouring this year's commitment to them.

I will mention this at the next meeting also but I wanted to flag that we are going to have a trial of sending the bulletin email with a hyperlink that will take you to the website so that you can view the bulletin. I hope this does not cause any concern for members. It should make it easier to distribute without causing anyone anxiety.

Recently you have received a copy of the letter from Dr John Hall from the Foundation for Homeless Youth. It seems fairly clear to us that we will not be receiving any money back from this project. Whilst it is disappointing I think it is time to move on. We will however be sending a representative from our club to the AGM when the date has been set.

There does not seem to be an interest in the club being involved in the Youth Exchange Program so we will not be participating.

I would like to thank Malcolm Clowes for holding a position on the board as President Elect for the time prior to Sean accepting the position. Thank you Malcolm, your contribution was valued.

It is interesting to note that the 'BookFest' generates more income than both our markets and is run in April. Basically the books are donated from individuals, charities and others. The books are catalogued and stored in a warehouse and are collected throughout the year.


