PRESIDENTS REPORT 19 MARCH 2014

Last Wednesday's talk by Rotarian and ROMAC District representative Norm Casey was particularly interesting and thought provoking for a couple of reasons. Firstly, the project itself. For newer members ROMAC is "Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children" and over about 25 years Rotary donations have enabled children in third world Oceania areas to have access to major operations in Australia. Many operations have been clearly of a lifesaving nature. Some have rectified gross disfigurement, which has enabled these

children to be accepted in their own community. Secondly, while we had ROMAC presentations from time to time, it has not been foremost in our minds at budget time. I intend to raise our commitment to ROMAC at our next Board meeting.

Some time ago I mentioned the ANZAC Centenary Local Grants Programme to you. I have been particularly keen to have our club apply for funding for a worthwhile project to mark this important time. You will recall that I asked for suggestions from members on a number of occasions, and I did receive a couple of worthwhile suggestions

Secretary Paul suggested the following, which we have developed into a submission for funding. The proposal is for a pathway passing through five substantial arches, each representing one of the years of the WW1 conflict. The pathway will lead to an area of reflection, a simple paved area surrounded by five benches.

Set in the pathway, as well as along the sides of the pathway, and in the area, will be a series of storyboards reflecting on many of the battle areas.

In conjunction with this permanent structure, we will be running an essay competition for Year 6 Students, the theme being some aspect of ANZAC. What is appealing about this project is the permanent nature of it, probably situated near the Community Centre, combined with a link with young students who need to have exposure to this aspect of Australia's history. I will keep you informed.

On a more mundane matter, we recently held a Special General Meeting to vote on an updated Constitution to take in changes arising from last Year's RI Council on Legislation. We have received approval from the Department of Justice for our revised Constitution, and it is now being loaded onto our website. And all done without spending money on lawyers!!

I am happy to provide a hard copy to any member, but be aware that any requests might be passed to the Sergeant-at-Arms who might incorporate a short test on content in his fines session!

Geoff Taylor has once again volunteered to drive the support vehicle for the Rotary Ride for Research next week, leading to the District Conference. Geoff has been doing this now for a number of years, raised money in the process and we wish him a safe and enjoyable week. Tuesday night there is a dinner to welcome the Group Study Exchange team from the USA. 
