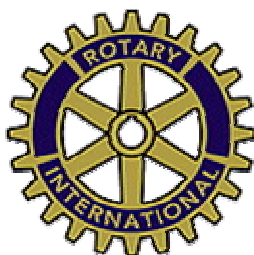

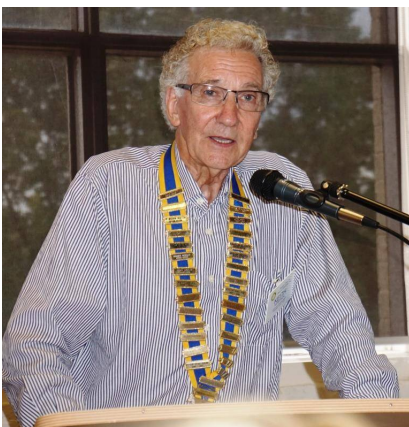

To All Club Presidents

We are all very concerned about the plight of our Fijian friends following the devastating cyclone that went thru that region over the weekend.

You may not be aware that there is currently a team of D9810 members, volunteers and students from Deakin University in Fiji on an ABCD project. PDG Tony Monley who is leading the team, along with Kathy, report that they are safe, but there are basically no communications systems at present.

I am certain with the number of our clubs that have relationships with various Fijian communities will want to help. Rotary in Fiji is part of D9920, a New Zealand District. I have made contact with my colleague Governor, Jennie Herring to identify immediate and ongoing needs.

When more definitive information becomes available I will come back to you with specific opportunities for our clubs to become involved in relief or reconstruction projects.

I am certain that Disaster Aid Australia and Shelterbox would already have sprung into action and it may be that some first response assistance can be provided via these organisations. In the longer term community rebuilding projects will need our help and it is these that I hope our District Clubs will be able to assist.

I will keep you informed.
