Welcome to 2016 and hopefully a great year for Mt. Waverley Rotary Club. In last week's bulletin you would have read about the work that ROMAC (Rotary Oceanic Medical Aid to Children) is doing to restore dignity and in some cases saving lives of our Pacific neighbours. You will also have noticed the cost in enabling these operations to take place, well beyond a million dollars last year. ROMAC has a very hard working committee and fund raising is an ever present concern to help these children. Whilst our club has donated in the past and I hope will continue to do so in the future, you can help personally with absolutely not having to donate 1 cent. What you can do and I would ask you to do, is that every letter you receive that has a postage stamp on it, that you remove it from the envelope with a reasonable margin of paper around it and I will collect them on behalf of ROMAC. ### D9810 2015/16 District Grant - Available Funds

This is a report to AGs, Presidents and Foundation Chairs on the Grants Committee's December review of available funds, and how they can be used further. It has been brought up to date since then and reflects the current situation as at 11<sup>th</sup> January. There is a small amount of District Grant money available for further grant projects, the use of which will be according to the guidelines outlined below. We received \$101,215 AUD for the 2015/16 Grant. Local and International Projects

Of the 16 projects nominated for The Foundation's approval of the Grant, 10 of these projects have been approved and a further 3 will be approved in the next month or so. The remainder were withdrawn or not applied for. The 13 live projects account for \$47,169.

Since the beginning of December, 12 Applications have been received for projects that were not nominated, and these formed a "waiting list" pending a review of the use of the remaining money. 10 of these have now been approved, information is to be finalised for another, and 1 is to be approved having provided a supplier quotation. Low-Level Scholarship Grants

Also by the beginning of December we had 7 notified Low-Level Scholarship projects. These are the projects that commit a club to support one or two students for both the 2015/16 and 2016/17 years. One (1) of these has been approved, and once the school year commences, <u>applications are required by the end of February</u>, for the others. 10 scholarship grants were planned originally and have been retained, so a further 3 of these grants are available for clubs that have not already received one.

#### Men's Health Forums

An allowance was originally planned to support 5 projects on men's health and/or domestic violence. This support is up to \$2,000 per event. As there has been no claim on this money up to now, \$4,000 is retained for the purpose and \$6,000 was released for District Grants. Please contact the Grants Committee when you have an opportunity to use these funds.

#### Remaining Grant Funds

As a result of this activity, there is approximately \$5,500 of the grant money still available. Therefore it has been decided that it be split for grants of from \$1,000 - \$2,000 for use only on local projects. Grant applications for these projects will be approved on a "first in and approved" basis.

Summary

There is money available for three further Low-Level scholarship Grants and three humanitarian/educational grants. However, should any of the approved grant projects fail, or not require the amounts claimed, the unused money could well support further grants. It will be worth while checking DG Fund availability with your AG, whom the Grants Committee will keep updated on the current situation.

Finally, the District website has been upgraded to include all Forms required for administering the District Grant. Please be sure that applications are made ONLY on the new forms, and are completed on a computer. Handwritten forms have caused problems in the past, and will not be accepted.

We look forward to using all the Grant money for good projects and such that, unlike last year, we don't have to return an amount approaching \$11,000!
