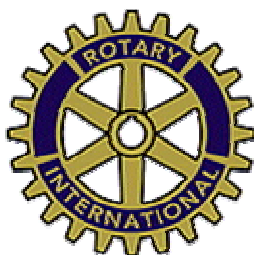

Bradley Bola and the new nose

This morning the reveal of Bradley's new nose took place at Prof. Andrew Heggie's rooms. A very happy young man saw his new face and was shaking with joy. I have posted a photo on facebook and had comments from Rotary friends across the Northern Hemisphere as well as local friends. I have attached the photos for you all. We have the eye surgery next and the first appointment is on Friday. We are hoping that Bradley will be able to attend RYLA in July before the operation on his eye. Your ongoing support for ROMAC and the donations from clubs and individuals that make this work possible is much appreciated.



Update on Bradley Bola 17th June

With the mountain mist and light rain we headed off to catch the train to the city and an appointment with Dr Lionel Kowal the eye specialist who will do the operation on July 15th. The disease which Bradley has had since birth has caused major problems with the muscles of the eye requiring re positioning of the to provide forward vision and improved facial appearance.

Dr Kowal saw Bradley during his major surgery in 2014 and said that he could help. Now 18 months later Bradley is preparing for this last operation he has hoped for over many years. Dr Kowal discussed the research from around the world and described from the MRI pictures and measurements, what the operation involves, and the high success rate for such delicate surgery. We await the final details but the operation is planned for July 15th at St Vincent's Hospital, East Melbourne. He will be in recovery for two weeks and return to PNG following final medical clearances.

The support from our volunteers and clubs will see Bradley holidaying with the McIntyre Family next week, taking part in the the D9810 RYLA camp from July 4th and being at the DG Visit to the sponsor RC. Nunawading on July 13th.

We are still trying to arrange for him to see the Melbourne Storm Rugby League Club game on June 26th.
