Vale Geoffrey Blackburn

The Rev Geoffrey Blackburn OAM, CM, PDF. (07/11/1914 – 13/07/2014)

Our oldest member died a few days ago just short of being a centenarian. His age 99.8 reads like Don Bradman's batting average. The Don went out for a duck in his last innings when he needed just a few more runs and his average would have topped 100. Likewise with Geoffrey...a few more months and he'd have topped the ton.

The Thanksgiving Service for the life of Geoffrey held at the Syndal Baptist Church on Friday afternoon was extremely well attended. Past members of our Club in attendance included Stuart Bales, Peter Fallu, Jim Gallagher, Ron Lear, Jack Mitchell, Graham & Terri Norcott and Rex Willmer. Current members in attendance: Malcolm & Ros Clowes, Pat and Marilyn Lannan, Terry O'Brien, Paul Power and Terry Roche. There were probably others there too and there were many written apologies. All of this shows how Geoff's long life touched the lives of thousands of others. He was indeed a Man of God.

What matters most for us now is to reflect on what the Rev Geoffrey Blackburn represented for our Rotary Club.

First, he was a Charter member and at that time in 1985, he was 70 years of age. Many would say that he'd left it too late to join Rotary. Not so with this Rev. He was forever tackling new things right up to his last days. He remained a member until he was 84 and thereafter an active honorary member.

Secondly, Geoff was the only member of our Club with a classification of Religion. This was further refined to: Protestantism. In the 30 years of our history that classification remains unique. Religion in Clubs and community groups can often be very divisive. In Geoff's case it was binding force within our group. He was always generous with his time, counselling members and their families in times of tragedy, grief, loss and illness.

Thirdly, Geoff was the second member in our Club to receive a Paul Harris Fellowship. That was awarded on his outstanding service to the community. Incidentally, the first PHF was awarded to Catherine Wallace (wife of Neville) for her dedication to the needs of others. Finally, there is no doubt that the Rev Geoffrey Blackburn was His Master's servant and literally His Master's Voice. Long may he live and represent us before the throne of God.
