Youth Services

SEMINAR

I mentioned at a recent meeting that the District Youth Services Seminar was to be held on Thursday 12 February 2015. This Seminar is one of the better, more informative District meetings, the objective being to present to selected teachers, and to Club Youth Services Rotarians, a summary of the Rotary Youth Services programmes.

Geoff Logie-Smith and I invited key teaching staff from Highvale, Avila and Mount Waverley Secondary College to attend as our guests. Highvale didn't respond in time, I believe due to staff changes at the College. However Senior Campus Principal of Mount Waverley Secondary College Julie Cain, and both Kelly Bunning and Christine Valladares from Avila attended, and were very impressed with the presentations.

The format is that students that have attended, and been significant achievers at the various Rotary programmes, presented a summary of their experiences, and then made themselves available for questions.

Any members that are interested in knowing more about these programmes should ask me, or Geoff. There is also an excellent booklet that can be downloaded from the 9810 website. We have circulated an electronic copy of the booklet to the above schools, as they have expressed interest in many of the programmes. Of course, the extent to which we will be able to sponsor students for the programmes will, as always, be limited by our revenue.

As always this is a popular programme and we are likely to have our budgeted four teams, with requests for more.

ANZAC Centenary Local Grants Programme

I was pleased to advise members at a recent meeting that our Club has been successful in securing a grant of \$30,000 under the ANZAC Centenary Local Grants Programme announced by local Federal MP Anna Burke in late 2013.

Paul Power developed a concept for a memorial walkway, and this, combined with a primary school writing competition, passed through the succession of Government assessment filters and attracted the requested sum. A small committee comprising Paul, Geoff Logie-Smith and myself have been progressing this project, and some of the matters we have had to deal with are as follows:

- 1. Design and drawings. Kevin Morris, Registered Building Designer from KS Build in Mitcham has been briefed, and we have had several meetings with him to progress the design.
- 2. The location for the walkway will be a section of the North Eastern pathway leading to the car park behind the Mount Waverley Community centre. There have been on-site meetings as well as meetings in Council offices.
- 3. The Club has received and signed a 20 page agreement with the Australian Government, to arrange for the funds to be remitted to our Club.
- 4. There have been many meetings and discussions regarding the selection of suitable materials for the structure. The materials must be long lasting, with an appearance that is in keeping with the era depicted.
- 5. As the structure is on Council land, we will need to enter into an agreement with the Council. The Council has agreed to undertake the major part of the construction, the paving and the erection of signage.
- 6. Our Committee will need to arrange for signage, the appropriate text, and the extensive consultation with local interest groups that is expected by the Council.

In summary this is a major project for our club, and will require a significant time commitment on the part of the committee. We might need to ask for assistance with specific tasks. Terry Roche, on behalf of Paul and Geoff
