Dear D9810 ROMAC Volunteers,

Over recent days I have sent emails, as below, to clubs who have not as yet donated to ROMAC this Rotary year, asking if they would consider us when making their end-of-year disbursements.

"Dear President and International Service Director,

As we near the end of this Rotary year, I am writing to clubs who have not as yet donated to ROMAC to ask if your club would consider ROMAC when reviewing your end-of-year disbursements.

Your D9810 ROMAC Committee has had a particularly busy year in 2016/17 with three patients hosted within the District for 5 months whilst undergoing life changing medical treatment at Monash Medical Centre, St Vincent's Private and the Royal Children's Hospital. Further, the arrival of another child this Rotary year is imminent. Whilst the ROMAC volunteers within D9810 are more than pulling their weight at the 'sharp end' of ROMAC, i.e. tending

sick children, the donations from our clubs that help support this activity have been trending down over the last few years; with only 17 clubs donating a total of \$18,800 last Rotary Year. For some reason, the efforts made by ROMAC within the District seem to go unnoticed.

In order to give our District clubs something more obvious and tangible to support, the D9810 ROMAC Committee has set a goal for D9810 clubs to:

'SAVE THE LIVES OF TWO ROMAC PATIENTS EACH YEAR'

As the average cost per ROMAC patient is around \$25,000, it would be an outstanding result if we could say that D9810 clubs were directly responsible for giving life to two extremely ill children from countries less fortunate than our own.

COMMUNITY - ANZAC CENTENARY WALKWAY GETS A SPRUCE UP

The ANZAC Centenary Walkway in the gardens of the Mount Waverley Community Centre was today given a makeover in preparation for ANZAC Day 2017.

The walkway, funded by the Commonwealth Government was built in 2015 as a joint project between the Rotary Club of Mount Waverley and the Monash City Council. A feature of the walkway is five wooden arches made of ironbark to reflect the materials used by ANZAC diggers in World War 1.

Although the timber arches are expected to weather well for many decades, club members decided to re-apply a timber preservative to the arches as additional protection. Plaques along the walkway signifying the major battles fought during the war were also given a clean.

Paul, Charlie, Geoff L-S, Sean and Terry all pitched in, and the job was completed in two hours. Thanks also to Beth for the refreshments.
