Last week we had a good turnout of 13 Rotarians and their guests who ventured out to the Western suburbs to visit the DIK warehouse complex in West Footscray. For those who made the journey it was fascinating to see just what happens to the huge array of donated goods including hospital beds, medical supplies, school desks, bikes, books, and clothing that make their way to various countries in SE Asia, Africa and the Pacific. Goods are generally shipped via 40'container's and on average one every 2 weeks and forward plans included shipments to Timor Leste, Cambodia, Ethiopia, South Sudan and Tanzania. I would like to thank both Bob Glindeman and Laurie Fisher for their kind hospitality and taking the time in giving us a tour of the warehouse and explaining the working of the DIK operation. Many thanks also must go to Geoff Taylor for his efforts in arranging our visit – well done Geoff. I would also like to thank those Rotarians from Monash and Oakleigh who also joined us for the visit.



ROMAC Subject: R-1125 Lucilia - Update

Dear D9810 ROMAC Team.

Lucilia had her first appointment at RCH this morning and met the medical staff who will be managing her case. In the attached photo they are RCH Prof Michael Sullivan, RCH Oncology Nurse Jayne Harrison, Peter Mac Dr Greg Wheeler, and RCH Dr Julie Cayrol.




Lucilia has been diagnosed with a nasal phasogele carcinoma which has been significantly reduced by the chemotherapy she has received at the Dili Hospital but which will now require radiation to stop it continuing to grow. The radiation treatment at Peter Mac is expected to go for 6 weeks, M-F, for 40 mins per session. She will visit Dr Wheeler at Peter Mac on Wed for further tests and creation of a mask which she will have to wear during treatment. At that time we will learn when her treatment will start. After the radiation at Peter Mac she will have a further 2 sessions of chemo in Dili to finalise her treatment. There is then a very good chance that the cancer will not grow back, although a 100% guarantee cannot be given.

At present Lucilia has no symptoms and is as well as can be expected; although well below percentile for her weight and height. We have a mission to fatten her up! The radiation treatment itself is not painful but towards the end of the 6 weeks treatment she may experience a swollen and sore throat. This may require her to be fed by nasal gastric tube, or hospitalisation in RCH if necessary. However, this will all settle down before she returns home.

As you can see in the attached photo, she is a bright little girl who happily accepted some fancy head wear from Jayne the Oncology Nurse and who enjoyed meeting the Meerkats.

A day of changing fortunes today (Wed 21st). Lucilia was a little off her appetite this morning but had fun joining host mum Robyn in a dance group.





At the meeting with Dr Wheeler, host mum Robyn drew his attention to the fact that she thought that Lucilia had a slight fever. This was confirmed by Dr Wheeler and he made arrangements for her to visit Dr Sullivan at RCH for a check up and possible medication. As it turned out, Lucilia was admitted to hospital with a possible chest infection and heart ailment. Santina, her guardian, will remain with her in hospital and more tests are scheduled for tomorrow.



The good news is that Lucilia had a good day yesterday (Fri 21st) in RCH and she is being discharged home to Robyn and Ken this morning. She even ventured to the outdoor playground at RCH yesterday and was introduced to the wonders of her first Macca's (note photo). Well the doctors did say she had to put on some weight!!

Her temperature came down yesterday after her antibiotic treatment and tests have shown that she did not have an infection. An ECG did however show a thickening of one of her heart valves. This is of no immediate concern but another ECG will be taken after she has finished her radiation treatment at Peter Mac.

She also had a previously arranged MRI whilst in hospital to get a good 'picture' of the neck tumour (nasal phasogele carcinoma) in order to assist with 'aiming' the radiation treatment. It showed that the tumour is 'dead' but the MRI could not detect if there are any tumour 'seeds' present, by which the tumour spreads through other tissue. The aim of the radiation is to stop these 'seeds' from spreading and developing. However, what the MRI did also detect is that the tumour had infiltrated two of her neck vertebrae, which have compressed slightly, limiting her sideways and up/down movement. An Orthopaedic doctor has been called in to advise what other treatment may be required. There will be a meeting with Dr Sullivan, her oncologist, and the Orthopaedic doctor, at 1pm Monday at which time we will get a better idea of her treatment plan.

In the meantime, Lucilia and Santina will have a quiet weekend home with Robyn and Ken. Over the last few days Lucilia and Santina have experienced a lot of new and scary things occurring to them and I am extremely grateful for the support of Robyn, Ken and Yulitta (one of our Tetum interpreters) who have been with them every step of the way.
