Information on Waverley Industries (topic of our meeting 4th November)

Waverley Workshop Industries (WWI) was conceived from an idea by the Mulgrave Apex Club in 1977. A committee of 6 members lead by the late Mike Russell a Rotarian of our club for several years before he died 19 years ago, investigated the need for a sheltered workshop in the then Waverley municipality and found that there were at least 450 members of the community of 200,000, who could use such a facility. The name W.W.I. was registered and the company started in 1981 with 16 disabled employees and a staff of 3 including a CEO. Land was leased from the Waverley council and a small factory building was erected at a cost of \$200,000.

The main type of work was packaging and the business grew year by year.

In 1980, the first CEO Terry Lawler died from a heart attack and was replaced by Les Morgan who managed the business for the next 10 years when he too died from prostate cancer. At that time the business came close to bankruptcy and being discontinued.

Frank Cresia was appointed as CEO in 2000 and turned a failed business into one of the benchmarking Australian Disability Enterprises in Australia today. Currently ranked as 3rd in the country for its success it now employs 230 disabled people with a staff of 30 working across 2 sites, the original one in Notting Hill and the 2nd. site, now owned by Waverley Industries Limited and opened by Senator Mitch Fifield last Friday in Hallam, where the disabled compliment of employees will be 150 people.

The club recently donated money to purchase a defibrillator which will be featured in a future edition of the Bulletin.

Baker IDI Bright Sparks Programme

Members would be aware that for some years now, our club has provided sponsorship to Baker IDI Heart and Diabetes Research Institute PhD Student Researchers. Our sponsorship is relatively small, but provides valuable assistance for some students to travel to overseas conferences to further their knowledge and experience.

I attended the Baker IDI annual lunch last Thursday, where selected students presented an overview of their work. I met the three students that our Club sponsored last year, and they provided a report of their work. These Travel Grant Reports are available to any member who would like a copy.

Matthew Snelson is investigating how dietary advanced glycation end products (AGE's) contribute to the development of diabetic kidney disease. AGE's are formed during the heating of foods containing proteins and sugars, and are highly prevalent in many modern processed foods.

Haloom Rafehi is investigating endothelial cells, the cells that line the insides of our blood vessels, and are prone to inflammation in many diseases, including diabetes. Inflammation is an early step in the development of cardiovascular disease and atherosclerosis. Haloom is investigating the "switches" that turn the inflammation genes on and off.

Celine Latouche has been focussing on molecular regulatory mechanisms in human skeletal muscle. Celine was explaining to me that type 2 diabetes disposition has been identified in foetal tissue in healthy females who do not have Type 2 diabetes, and her research seeks to understand how and why this occurs.

I am always impressed by these "Bright Sparks" and enjoy filling in for Glen at these presentations.

Subject: Monash Children's Hospital Children Fun Day - Jells Park Sunday 22 November

As you may know, District 9810 is helping Monash Children's Hospital with this fundraising event. It will comprise about 40 market stalls and some toddler rides and games. Many of you will already have been approached by the event coordinator AG Claire Button to provide stalls and are doing so. Rotary Club of Monash has been nominated to organise the logistics for this event, and we are seeking assistance with people power to be event marshals on the day.

It will be held in Jells Park between Madeline's Restaurant and Jells Lake on open lawn. There will be three main tasks

- Set up between 6am to 10am
- Managing the day between 10am and 4pm
- Pull down between 4pm and 6pm

We are expecting about 4,000 visitors to the event, who will perhaps stay for 2 hours on average. We estimate about 400 cars will be there for this event at any one time and they will take up at least 60% of the Jells Park in ground parking spaces. The major task is managing parking and vehicle movements, because the park will be used by other regular park visitors at the same time.

The second task will be as safety marshals and general admin assistants during the event and during set up and set down.

We have put a risk management and traffic management plan to the park managers Parks Victoria, which they are considering.

The following sets out the proposed numbers required for event marshals.

As you can see we need a maximum of 30 marshals in the peak periods, ramping down to 16 to 18 during set up set down. Two of these marshals on any shift may need some background in security and first aid but Victoria Police and the Royal Flying Doctor Service will be providing the main support here.

RC Monash will provide management and some of these numbers but, being a small club, we need your help. This communication formally asks for your assistance.

Over the next two weeks we will be mobilising equipment and position/task descriptions for the marshals, which we will get to you a week before the event. It will help if some of you have Working with Children tickets. There will be formal tool box meeting before each of your shifts so the tasks will be clearly spelled out.

If you can provide your own club or private Hi-Viz vests and Rotary caps that would be great. Also if it is possible to come in the least amount of vehicles (i.e. share). That will take a load off the parking which will be one of our major management tasks.

This is a major fund raising effort for the District and has the full support of Monash Children's Hospital. We are also asking them for resources to help out on the day.
