ROMAC Anton Da Silva – Update 20 June 2016.

Dear D9810 Team and Supporters,

Since the last update Anton has completed his hospitalisation for his 7th Chemotherapy cycle and is home with Dianne and Bill, essentially enjoying a 'normal' existence. He has not had any infection and, apart from daily visits by the nurse, the only other medical treatment he had was a blood transfusion last Fri, as his white blood cell count was low (expected after chemo). Over the weekend his blood count was on the way up and it is expected to be normal by tomorrow.

Anton has been enjoying life, eating anything put in front of him and participating in Scottish dancing and car club activities with Dianne and Bill. He and Claudina thoroughly enjoy these outings and are well known, and bring much joy, to the other club members. He is doing very well and is a typical robust 2yo boy pushing the boundaries. A far cry from the very sick baby who arrived last Dec. To that end, Claudina thinks his mum, Emaldina, is in for a big shock when he gets home.

On 6 Jul, Anton will have a full set of scans completed and on 7 Jul we will have a discussion with his doctor. At this time, there are no plans for further chemo and it is thought that we will receive the ok for Anton and Claudina to go home. In anticipation of this, the nursing staff, and Dianne, have been adjusting his medication and instructing Claudina in how to apply it.

All being well, this time next month, Anton will be home with his family in Timor Leste.

Network. Here's an overview of what the Network is about: The Amaroo Leadership Network is a group composed of school captains from public secondary schools in the City of Monash. Our aim to connect and engage school and wider communities through student-led initiatives. This Network was established to maximise local student connections, enhance leadership skills and utilise available funds from the Engage program of the Department of Health and Human Services to create a positive change in the Monash community. We are supported by our

coordinator of the Amaroo Neighbourhood Centre, Tamara Grant. We were formed to build positive relationships with surrounding schools, not in the competitive nature of inter-school competitions, but to work together and share resources that will allow youth to create a positive impact and change. We aim to connect with people and build a sense of community within the City of Monash.

The Network's first project is a family movie night (screening the family favourite 'Big Hero 6') that will be held on Tuesday 5 July, 7pm-9pm, at the Clayton Community Theatrette. Tickets are **\$10 for a family** and **\$3 for individuals**, and light movie snacks will be available for purchase on the night. All proceeds will go towards the Amaroo Neighbourhood Centre to
