### FOUNDATION

One of my aims in this new Rotary year is to have the majority, if not all members become Centurions. The Centurion Membership is an Australia wide principle to achieve a tax deductible way to raise funds for the Rotary Foundation charity, <u>"to do good"</u> in the world. It is also the most sincere method of giving to charity, not knowing who the ultimate recipient will be and the recipient not knowing who the individual donor is. In addition, unlike many charities, every dollar donated will be used to fund the charitable cause which may be providing safe potable water and sanitation to third world country communities, preventing and treating diseases such as malaria, dysentery or AIDS, providing food and education to underprivileged children and even providing peaceful solutions to conflict ravaged parts of the world, amongst many other worthwhile projects.

The definition of Centurion derives from the Latin word for 100 and the commitment to become a Centurion is the donation of \$100 AUD annually. In effect, this translates into \$1.92 per week.

For many members, this donation is made with the renewal of the annual Rotary membership dues, the invoice of which will be issued by our Treasurer Lyn in the next week or so.

Individual tax deductible receipts will be issued by the District Centurion Officer in due course. For those members who are not current Centurions, I would like to suggest that you regard Rotary as your favourite charity and I'm sure if you are unable to contribute a lump sum, Lyn can make a way of paying in quarterly or half yearly subscriptions. I would also like to encourage those current Centurion members to renew their membership through Lyn so that records can be kept up to date.

It would be great to have every member in our club as a Centurion. I have included a subscription form with this week's bulletin.

There is also a great reward for being a Centurion and that is, all donations to the Centurion Club are eligible for the purchase of a Paul Harris fellowship when they total \$1,000 USD.
