ROMAC

Dear D9810 ROMAC Volunteers,

We are nearly half way through this Rotary year so I thought it a good idea to update everyone on where we are at at present. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Norm Casey for stepping into the Chair position whilst I was away for a couple of months.

Condolences

Sadly, in recent months, we have lost two ROMAC stalwarts; Jason Chetty and Max Walker. Jason was a member of our D9810 ROMAC Committee and was a strong advocate for ROMAC. He enthusiastically took on his role of presenting to clubs and he, and Intha, home hosted Heldericky Da Cruz and made time to visit our patients and take them on outings. Jason will be sadly missed and our condolences go out to Intha and family.

Max Walker, or 'Tangles' as he was known in his Australian cricketing days, was a key contributor in the establishment of ROMAC in 1988. In the early days he provided invaluable assistance in bringing an awareness of ROMAC and made himself available on countless occasions to energise support for ROMAC. He was our Australian Patron from the start and in that role supported our D9810 fundraising night in 2013 conducted by the RC of Wandin. In getting ROMAC up and running, Max Walker was the right man in the right place and he will be greatly missed.

Patients

After a very busy first few months of this Rotary year with our two patients, Teretoriano (Anton) Da Silva and Bradley Bola, things have quietened down somewhat since they returned home on 12 Jul and 16 Sep respectively. From all accounts, both have settled back home with no real issues.

Whilst we expected that Talitha Tagu from West New Britain would have been with us by now for treatment for a nasofrontal encehalocoele at MMC, her arrival has been delayed due to problems in getting a birth certificate produced, a requirement in having her visa issued. An aunt is now helping with this process but we have been advised by our ROMAC Operations Manager that 'it will be some time yet'.

From a Southern Region perspective, a patient from Timor Leste for RCH has been allocated to D9800 and there are two patients (MMC) and one patient (RCH) awaiting hospital acceptance and one patient for RCH awaiting travel documents. So things could hot up for us in the new year if the patients for MMC eventuate.

Over the last month, two women have joined us as volunteers. Dawn McMahon from the RC of Bayswater and Jane Mulcahy, a friend of Intha Chetty. Welcome aboard Dawn and Jane.

Support from D9810 Clubs

In 14/15, 27 clubs in the district supported ROMAC by donating \$22,969. Last Rotary year, 18 clubs donated \$18,800 and so far this year, 8 clubs have committed \$9,100. Of the clubs that do donate, the average donation is around \$1,000 but it would be fair to say that the support that ROMAC receives from our D9810 clubs is declining. Last Rotary year, PDG David Tolstrup set a goal for district clubs to fund an Interplast Team (\$43,000) and, in the event enough funds were raised by district clubs, to fund 1 1/2 teams.

Consequently, what I would like to do is set our clubs a similar goal for ROMAC. As the average cost per ROMAC patient is around \$25,000, if the 44 clubs in the district could donate an average of \$1,000 we would be in the ball park of funding the treatment of two ROMAC patients. Thus, from now on, whenever our Committee members have the opportunity to talk at clubs, District Seminars and at the District Conference we will be saying that our **D9810 ROMAC Goal** is for D9810 clubs to 'SAVE THE LIVES OF TWO ROMAC PATIENTS'.

It would be very much appreciated if we could get a two pronged approach happening and that you, as D9810 ROMAC Volunteers, advocate for ROMAC within your clubs and ask your clubs to support this goal and to donate to ROMAC this Rotary year.

Incidentally, over the last 3 years, D9810 has managed 9 ROMAC patients out of the 124 patients allocated to the 26 Rotary districts throughout Aust and NZ. So, in this regard, we are more than pulling our weight but, at any one time, some 30 children are on the ROMAC Waiting List, so the more funds we can raise, the more children are treated.
