### **ROMAC UPDATE**

Hello Rotary friends

Its now a fortnight since Linh Da's major reconstruction surgery, and she is progressing very well. After spending a further 6 days in ICU, she eventually moved to Ward 42 (Paediatric) at Clayton. Having been in ICU for almost 6 weeks it was quite a change. The wonderful staff in ICU were really quite sad to see her go but delighted for her improvement. She underwent a minor procedure on Friday to do some repair work and tidy up, and the change is truly quite remarkable. Her lower lip now looks normal.

We are advised that Linh Da will move to Dandenong on Monday, and expect her to be there for 4 to 6 weeks. Further surgery is planned for Monday October 6th, and again about 10 days after that (perhaps Friday 17th) with a further week to 10 days before she can go home (as in to her billet).

While she is still breathing through a tube, she is able to talk and eat most of the time, and can get out of bed and walk around her room and take herself to the bathroom. Keeping her entertained and occupied continues to be a challenge, and we are now developing plans for more meaningful activities than the DVDs and craft that have been her daily fare in recent weeks. The young are amazing explorers, and Linh Da is no exception. She and the nursing staff have been using an iPad with Google Translate to assist in communication: it's not accurate all the time, so we have lots of laughs with that. However our patient discovered You Tube when she moved to the ward (don't know who put that App on it), and soaked up 7GB of data in 5 days! An expensive diversion now blocked.

I have been liaising with the Social Worker at Clayton to develop a program of educational and extension activities, but we've been held up by school holidays. And of course we will have to start again on that if the move to Dandenong comes off tomorrow. That's the sort of challenge ROMAC presents.

We would welcome some assistance with the program we are preparing for her. She's been out of school now for 5 months, and we want to try to get her back on track with that. The hospital have teachers who attend a couple of days each week, and between them and the various therapists we will be able to develop meaningful activities. And teach her some English. If you would like to get involved please contact me.

Linh Da is going to face many challenges in her future, and while the surgery is by and large successful her appearance may well limit her opportunities. We'd like to think that we can send her home with the tools to harness her strength and determination so she can make a rewarding life for herself.

Of course we can't forget Mum Hanh when it comes to engagement, because she's now spent 7 weeks living in Ronald McDonald House. Our friend and leader of Kim's Foundation of Hope, Kim Thien Truong, has been marvellous in housing the two of them for the first 3 months, and then either living with Mum or travelling backwards and forwards most days to visit and interpret. Kim has been able to take Hanh home for the odd weekend respite, and last night they attended a Vietnamese concert. If you have any Vietnamese connections who could spare some time to be with Hanh and entertain her for a few hours I'm sure she would enjoy that.

At this stage of her recuperation Linh Da likes having visitors, so if you'd like to come out to Dandenong and spend a few minutes with her and Hanh I know they would appreciate that. Language is of course challenging, but smiles, warm voices and the occasional hug are a great substitute. I'm happy to help with your plans to ensure we don't have too many visitors at once. As is our usual request with ROMAC patients and parents, please be judicious with gifts. No money please, and no food for the next few days.

Your interest and support have been much appreciated by all of us, and we thank you for that. Gerry Phillips

WE ARE ONCE AGAIN RUNNING A MARKET SALE FROM A SITE AT THE OAKLEIGH MARKET ON SUNDAY 26 October 2014

WE NEED DONATIONS OF CLEAN SALEABLE GOODS FOR THIS GARAGE SALE. ITEMS IN GOOD WORKING ORDER THAT CAN FIT INTO A CAR BOOT FOR PICK UP ARE REQUIRED. WE NEED SMALL FURNITURE ITEMS, ELECTRICAL GOODS, KITCHEN WARE, GLASSWARE, ANY ITEMS THAT WILL BE OF VALUE TO SOMEBODY AT THE MARKET. PLEASE DON'T DONATE ITEMS THAT ARE BROKEN, OVER TEN YEARS OLD OR GENERALLY IN POOR CONDITION, AS THIS ONLY PRESENTS US WITH A DISPOSAL PROBLEM.

Until the sale date, goods may be delivered either to me or to Terry Roche. The goods will be stored at the Club's storage facility. Goods will be sold at Oakleigh's Sunday market probably utilising 2 car spaces. Terry Roche and I have agreed to provide us with a site and will generally support us with this project.

WE WILL REQUIRE SALES ASSISTANCE ON THE DAY. PLEASE NOTE THIS DATES IF YOU CAN ASSIST.

It is proposed that we have 3 members manning the stall from 8 am to 11 am and 3 members from 11 am to 2 pm. The first team will set up the stall and the second will dismantle and pack up.

### Types of goods required.

This is a suggested list, but suitability should be confirmed with either Terry or me. As a guide if it can't fit into a car boot it is unsuitable.

- Electrical appliances in safe working order. These will be tested before sale.
- New clothes in original packaging.
- Clean blankets in good condition.
- Small articles of furniture no larger than a chair.
- Kitchen appliances in good condition. Includes cooking utensils pots & pans.
- Dinner sets and cutlery.
- Office equipment and entertainment goods less than 5 years old.
- Fashionable jewellery, watches and clocks.
- Hard cover books, but not school books or textbooks. Car manuals and similar books OK.
- Objects d' art such as framed photos and prints, statues, pottery and Bric-a-Brac, subject to inspection and suitability. In other words if you would buy it then so will others!
- Garden implements and garage items such as tools etc.
- Sporting goods such as cricket sets and tennis racquets. Balls of all sizes in good condition
- Anything else with a good chance of sale able to be fitted into a car boot.

### Les Twentyman OAM

Youth Outreach Worker Social Campaigner Media Commentator Author

**Speakers Brief** 

Les Twentyman has been on the frontline of heartbreak and hope for over 30 years. As one of Australia's best known youth outreach workers and social campaigners, Les has developed his expert opinion the hard way - on the street.

Raised in Braybrook in Melbourne's West, Les has devoted his life to young people doing it tough, predominantly in but not restricted to, Melbourne's Western Suburbs.

Les is widely considered an expert on a range of community issues including youth homelessness, drug abuse, prison reform and social welfare. He is the first stop for Victorian and national media outlets for the word on "how it really is". He has featured in hundreds of television, radio & print press interviews and has been a regular newspaper columnist and article contributor. He also features in a number of documentaries, most notably "The Ohio Gun Buyback Scheme", "LA Gangs", "Can We Help", "20 Minutes with Twentyman" and "Heroin Without the Hype".

Since returning full-time to his first passion, The 20th Man Fund, he has shone a light on emerging youth issues like gang violence, weapons carriage, cyber bullying and the growing trend of truancy in our education system. The hard-hitting DVD "The Realities of Cyber Bullying" and Community Service Announcement - "Knives Trash Lives" are testament to Les" "pull no punches" approach to the damage caused to youth through peer pressure and social media.

Les is often called on to visit volatile regional areas of Australia in a bid to bring about harmony and cooperation where gangs and youth violence is a problem. He has also accompanied the Governor General, state Government ministers and leaders of industry to the 'mean-streets' of Australia they expect the width of never thought existed.

In addition to his tireless work with disadvantaged youth and media commentary, Les is a well credentialled public speaker. His speaking engagements include schools, community groups, service clubs, corporates, Government Departments and business conferences. He has also been engaged by AFL and NRI clubs to address young players on the pitfals of "celebrity". A testament to his reach was Les being asked by the Dalai Lama to introduce his Holiness at his Melbourne conference in June 2013.

Les is the founder of the 20th Man Fund, established 1984. The organisation is dedicated to providing educational, sporting, leadership, emotional and crisis support services to our homeless, disadvantaged and disconnected youth.
