Acting President's Report for 9 March 2016

This week our guest speaker was John Liddell, from the Energy Alliance organisation. John, who was a member of the Rotary Club of Richmond, and a sapphire Paul Harris Fellow, spends much of his time talking to Rotary Clubs these days about a number of his interests, many related to environmental issues. His talk this week was about how we can make our homes more energy efficient. John told us about the Energy Freedom Alliance which is a group of innovative and progressive Australian organisations working together to deliver energy freedom to Australian homes. Some of John's suggestions about how we can make our homes more energy efficient were:-

- Put solar panels on your roof, get rid of using gas. Technology will be available very soon to enable us to store solar energy produced during the day.
- Look at your heating systems gas ducted is not efficient as it costs a lot to produce the heat (electricity to
 drive the fan and gas to produce the heat much of it is lost in the ducts and vents). Modern heat pumps
 and reverse cycle heating/cooling units are more energy efficient and cleaner.
- Change your lights to LED ones, cheaper and more efficient.
- Review and renew your insulation it degrades over time and reduces in efficacy it can be put under floors and in wall spaces (expanding foam).
- Consider double glazing it is greatly under used in Australia
- Consider a heat pump for your hot water system as a booster
- Window coverings: padded pelmets and curtains are the most energy efficient of all window coverings retaining heat in winter and blocking out sun in summer.
- Awnings or window glazing to keep the sun from hitting your windows.
- Special sun reflective paint on your roof.

This was a very interesting presentation, which prompted many questions. John recognised the dilemma that energy charging structures presently available from the providers are yet to provide significant incentive to make major changes.

On another matter, I am working on a club manual which will include position descriptions for our key Chair and Committee positions. The objective is to give people who wish to take up these positions a quick "heads up" of the tasks involved, key contacts, and reporting guidelines. This should encourage new volunteers and reduce the feeling of being "thrown in the deep end" and thus wasting their time "wheel spinning". I am seeking the assistance of all Committee heads and Chairmen in providing this information.

Our next major Community Service project is the Good Friday Charity Golf day, once again supporting the Royal Children's Hospital Appeal. We will all be asking through the committee to give some time to assisting on the day, so please assist if you can.

The last week has been somewhat 'up and down' for Anton. After coming home from his last chemotherapy session at MMC on 20 Feb he was firing on all cylinders. His bloods were good and he was eating and sleeping well and entertaining visitors from the Timorese community. All was well as Norm and Denise Casey settled into their hosting role on Thu whilst Dianne and Bill took a well deserved long weekend away.

Things changed on Fri when Norm and Denise noticed that his temperature was rising. A trip to MMC confirmed that he had and infection and he was admitted for observation and treatment. At 2am Sunday morning he was admitted to ICU but was returned to the ward on Mon where he will remain until released tomorrow. I visited him today and he seems to be back to his old self, albeit with less hair and mouth ulcers, which were anticipated due to the chemotherapy.

On another matter, we were expecting the arrival of Bradley Bola this weekend for his eye and nose operations. Unfortunately, the PNG Immigration Medical Authorities were not happy with his Chest X-Ray and they have ordered another in 3 months time.
