#### PRESIDENTS REPORT

An interesting week, but I would like to make comment about last weekend's African violet show. Our Club has been very quick to donate \$500 to the Philippines disaster and members have asked that this be topped up, which the Board approved last Wednesday. Yet Glen struggled to get volunteers last Friday afternoon, and particularly last Sunday afternoon to assist for about an hour maximum to move a few tables and chairs around, for an easy \$250 for the Club coffers. Glen has already thanked those that did turn up.

I would like to particularly thank Janine and the Watkins children for assisting. We would have been stuck without them. Our membership has increased by about one third in the last 12 months. Let's hope that this situation doesn't happen again. There, I have that off my chest!

Last Tuesday night four of us attended the District Foundation Dinner, at which the keynote speaker was Gary CK Huang, International President Elect. An interesting speaker, Gary summarized his experiences and achievements in Rotary. His record in increasing membership and the chartering of new clubs in Taiwan in particular is quite remarkable. His major messages were that more money has been pledged for the completion on the polio plus project, and in relation to Rotary Foundation, the commitment to giving is one of the most efficient ways of assisting various local and international projects, as the full value of every dollar given is made available to these projects.

One of the "painless", tax effective and productive ways of giving is to become a centurion member, pledging a payment of \$100 per year to the Rotary Foundation. Talk to Adrian for more details.

Last Wednesday night's guest speaker, Joan Reid, shared her experience of having a daughter with an organic brain deficiency, together with a later diagnosis of autism. The main point from her talk was that the existing Government system for long term care in Victoria is very seriously deficient, and in many cases the clients are physically and emotionally abused. It was a very thought provoking talk that left the majority of us with a mixture of emotions.

At that meeting it was a pleasure to induct our newest member Philip McKenzie, the "better half" of our Membership Chairperson, Rhonda McKenzie. Philip is looking forward to contributing to the club and I am sure will be a great asset. Welcome Philip.
