Another fairly quiet meeting, attendance wise, as several members are still away on holidays. Gordon Oliver was scheduled to speak to us on his interesting work in Central Australia. Unfortunately due to a family commitment he had to cancel.

Robyn Morrow stepped up on very short notice and gave us a very interesting presentation on her recent trip to the Northern Territory. Not many of us are aware of the challenges of living in such remote locations

such as the Tiwi islands. We often take our access to health services for granted, and Robyn reminded us of how difficult it is to carry out tests for a range of fairly common eye diseases in such a remote aboriginal community.

I am attaching a letter received from Anna Burke MP regarding the ANZAC Centenary, and an allocation available to groups in the local electorate for appropriate projects to celebrate this important occasion.

It is highly likely that Rotary in Australia will be involved. I certainly expect that most clubs will have some commitment to the commemoration marking 100 years since the start of World War 1, and I believe that our Club should also be involved in the celebration in some way. While we might not necessarily want to involve ourselves at this time in the ANZAC Centenary Local Grants Programme, we should start thinking sooner rather than later about what form our involvement should take. The Board has this on the Agenda for future meetings, but we need feedback from members; whether or not we should be involved, and ideas for projects.



Proposed "Garage Sale" Project.

The Rotary Club of Mount Waverley in partnership with the Rotary Club of Oakleigh will conduct a Garage Sale of upmarket, new & second hand goods on Sunday the 27th. October at the Oakleigh Market from 8 am to 2 pm.

To this effect, it would be appreciated if you could source any of the items listed below from your own households, that of relatives, friends & neighbours now and over the next 8 weeks. Many of the items left out for the annual council collections are suitable, although we are not conducting a rubbish collection.

In an endeavour to limit left over rubbish and hence the disposal problem of same, it is requested that articles be clean and in working order, preferably less than 5 years old and certainly not more than 10 years old.

Until the sale date, goods may be delivered either to myself or to Terry Roche or they can be collected. The goods will be stored at the Club's storage facility.

The funds raised will be split between the two clubs and used for community projects. Type of goods required.

This is a suggested list, but suitability should be confirmed with either Terry or myself. Suffice to say, size of item(s) is important. If it won't fit into a car boot it is unsuitable.

- Electrical appliances in safe working order. These will be tested before sale.
- · New clothes in original packaging.
- Clean blankets in good condition.
- Small articles of furniture no larger than a chair.
- Kitchen appliances in good condition. Includes cooking utensils pots & pans.
- Dinner sets and cutlery.
- Office equipment and entertainment goods less than 5 years old.

- Fashionable jewellery, watches and clocks.
- Hard cover books, but not school books or textbooks. Car manuals and similar books OK
- Objects de arte such as framed photos and prints, statues, pottery and Bric-a-Brac, subject to inspection and suitability. In other words if you would buy it then so will others!
- Garden implements and garage items such as tools etc.
- Sporting goods such as cricket sets and tennis racquets. Balls of all sizes in good condition.
- Labelled tinned food, but no putrescibles.
- Anything else with a good chance of sale able to be fitted into a car boot.

Dear Graham

I am writing to encourage your organisation to apply for a share in \$100,000 worth of Federal Government funding allocated to my seat of Chisholm to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the First World War.

The Anzac Centenary will run from 2014 to 2018, marking 100 years since the Gallipcli landings and major Western Front battles, and stands to be one of the most important commemorative periods in Australia's history.

This locally driven grants program gives the community a say in how best to honour the service and sacrifice made by Australian men and women, by undertaking special projects in memory of those who served in the First World War. Nationally, the Australian Government will be providing \$83.5 million for a range of commemorative events and initiatives to mark the Centenary of Anzac.

The original ANZACS helped forge our national identity and define our national character. This is such an important landmark in Australian history and I am thrilled to see that the ANZAC legacy will continue to be handed down to younger generations through local and national commemorative events and projects being enabled through funding initiatives such as this.

Applications are now open and will close on 28 February 2014, with grant funding available from 1 July 2013.

As you may be aware, I will be working alongside a committee of local representatives to review grant applications before they are submitted to the Department of Veterans' Affairs.
