1. Report On Monster Mystery Garage Sale

I would like to thank all those people who donated goods and especially those members who helped on the day.

We have raised over \$1200 from the two garage sales this year and despite the intensive work involved in holding this project, I would recommend that we continue.

I would like to think that we could have a few more big ticket items particularly electrical white goods as they raise the greatest amount of revenue, but all items are gratefully accepted. The real beneficiaries will be the disadvantaged children at our annual Children's Christmas Party.

2. Christmas Dinner Breakup
