GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE

Dear Club Presidents and Assistant Governors.

D9810 GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE PROGRAM WITH DISTRICT 6580 INDIANA, USA February/March 2014

On behalf of the District 9810 Group Study Exchange committee I wish to invite all clubs in D9810 to take part in the Exchange with District 6580 Indiana from Saturday 22nd February to Monday 24th March 2014. The incoming team from Indiana will consist of a Team Leader and four team members. It is the responsibility of the hosting district to provide residential home hosting for the team members and to provide daily programs by one or more Rotary Clubs, as well as arrange vocational days for the team.

As yet we do not know the makeup of the Indiana team as it is not being selected until early December 2013.

CLUB DAYS:

Applications are now open to all Clubs who would like to be involved in this exchange by hosting the team for a day and arranging to visit places of cultural interest throughout our District, your local area or the City of Melbourne. You may like to share the day with another club in your cluster group. Further, the focus of this exchange is Healthcare and Education so it would be beneficial if some Club Day activities could be aimed at these areas. Please give it some consideration when planning your day.

Hosting the Team for a Club program day requires your Club, or to pick up team members from a designated meeting place, arrange activities for the day and return them the meeting point on completion of the day's events where they will be collected by their host families, or if it is the day of the Cluster dinner take them to the evening venue.

HOME HOSTING:

We are now taking applications from Rotarians of our district who would like to home host a team member for one week of the GSE program. There is an expectation that the Home Hosts will be available throughout their period of hosting to provide company for their guest when he/she is at home. Home hosts are also responsible for providing transport to the designated meeting place for the Club Days, and picking them up at the end of the day at the same place if required. As well, provide transport or arrange for the hosted team member to get to and from their vocational visits.
