



Teen has spirit for leadership

STUDENT EARNS TOP AWARD FOR BIG EFFORT

MT WAVERLEY student Neha Salahuddin has been given Monash's top gong for her community service.

Ms Salahuddin, 16, has been awarded this year's Sir John Monash Award for Outstanding Leadership and collected the Youth Leadership award earlier this month.

Ms Salahuddin fundraises for cystic fibrosis, was a finalist in the Rotary 4-Way public speaking contest and is an advocate for improving indigenous health and education.

"I wasn't expecting to win. I just did the fundraising because I loved it so much that I could bring about change," the Mount Waverley Secondary College (MWSC) student said. "The majority of people want to make a difference but don't know how. A little change can make such a big change."

MWSC head of student leadership Hayley Dureau, who nominated Ms Salahuddin, said she was a "truly a delightful young lady".

"She has excellent interpersonal and communication skills, always models appropriate behaviours and is well respected by students and staff in the college community," she said.

Ms Salahuddin attended the inaugural Cystic Fibrosis Leadership Camp last year and on her return organised a whole school casual clothing event which raised about \$3000.

Ms Salahuddin was also given a Pinewood Community Bank Leadership Award.

Ms Salahuddin will also compete in Rotary's Model United Nations Assembly competition later this year.

The Year 11 student is also helping to organise a Close The Gap day celebration at her school.

Ms Salahuddin also tutors maths to younger students and is a Kwon Lee Dow Scholar at Melbourne University.

She also won the Waverley RSL's Norman A Smith Memorial scholarship last year.

Mayor Geoff Lake said Ms Salahuddin exemplified the enduring sense of community spirit in Monash.

"We have so many people who go out of their way to help others, whether it is to check on the welfare of their neighbour or to deliver Meals on Wheels or to coach their kid's football team or any number of other volunteer activities," he said.

Neha Salahuddin won an award for being a role model in Monash.
