We have a potential new member coming along this week. So once again would you please consider who you believe to be good community members that would enjoy and be able to contribute to or club.



ANZAC CENTENARY WALKWAY

The Australian Government via the ANZAC Centenary Grants Programme has provided \$30,000 to the Rotary Club of Mount Waverley for the building of a memorial walkway along the North East pathway in the grounds of the Waverley Community Centre.

The walkway will comprise a series of five arches, representing each of the years of WW1.

Between each arch will be a plaque summarising some of the fields of conflict in that year. Halfway along the walkway will be a reflection area to one side, with signage highlighting the sacrifices of the ANZACS during WW1. A seat in the reflection area, and signage at each end, will complete the structure.

Monash Council has given full support to this project. Under the terms of our Grant, Completion is required by 30 June 2015.

Residents of the City of Monash who would like further information about this project are encouraged to direct their enquiries to Paul Power, Terry Roche, Geoff Logie-Smith or Philip McKenzie via the Mount Waverley Rotary Club.
