





### **ROMAC**

Anton Da Silva - Update 30 May 16

Dear D9810 ROMAC Team and Supporters,

Since my last update on 12 May, Anton, Claudina and Dianne and Bill Sides have had their fair share of 'ups and downs'.

Anton commenced his 6th chemotherapy cycle (this time with the more powerful drug) on 16 May and, on his return home a couple of days later, he was his normal self for a few days. However, on 19 May he had a bad night and woke up miserable and this persisted for the next week (many sleepless nights for the family). On 27 May he was admitted to hospital with an infection and he has been there ever since. He was given a blood transfusion to improve his bloods but his temperature rose to 40 degrees at one stage over the weekend. Thankfully, today the infection is getting under control but he will be in hospital for a few more days until his bloods improve. Claudina has been struggling.

On top of everything, a chest xray to check on the infection (which was clear) showed that Anton's Hickman's Line (used to administer drugs directly into a vein in his chest) has moved slightly and his doctors are currently deciding whether he will need surgery to get it back into position.

All in all a difficult couple of weeks.

Update on Bradley Bola.

Hello everyone, here is a brief report on Bradley Bola and ROMAC activities since his arrival from PNG on Sunday 29th May.

The arrival was 15 minutes early (tail wind from Cairns) after being met there by Rtn. Mike Woods. Host father Michael Cox and I met Bradley who has settled back in with Teresa & Michael in Vermont. Kaye Leck again came to the party with a Computer loan during his stay, and Dianne & Gavin McIntyre (R.C.Wandin) are helping with supporting activities. The sponsoring club RC.Nunawading through Rtn. Harvey Lane are sharing the information and support.

The Medical process commenced on Monday with a CT scan for surgeon Prof. Andrew Heggie. We then had a consultation on Tuesday morning to discuss the operation on his nose to improve his breathing and fix his septum. This operation will take place at Epworth Richmond on Saturday 4th with 6.30 am start. Bradley will be in hospital over the weekend and will be reviewed next Wednesday. An MRI scan was taken on Tuesday afternoon for preparation for the operation to straighten his eye by Mr Lionel Kowal in July.

We have had support from the Imaging Center who are involved with the Storm Rugby League Club of which Bradley is a fan and we hope to arrange for him to attend a match and meet his favorite players later in June. The D9810 ROMAC committee meets on Friday 3rd to review progress on the patients, club presentations, fundraising and the District Conference and Assembly activities.

Thank you for your support in the past and we look forward to the future of ROMAC together.
